

## "Superior Performance"



This year marks Cheryl's 17th year as a member of the Harford County Women's Bowling Association.

Cheryl first started bowling at age 17 when Marilyn Lastowski (teacher) brought the students from Aberdeen High School to Harford Lanes for Inter-Mural play.

In 1985 Cheryl began bowling in the HCWBA leagues, starting in the Thursday Ladies Late league at Harford Lanes. She ended that first season with a 118 average. With her average improving every year after, she went on to win many high series, high games and high averages in the leagues.

Venturing on to tournaments Cheryl's determination and superior bowling ability started to show and she won many titles and awards at the Local and State levels.

In 1994 her team won the Challenge of Champions with 2763, and, her team won again in 1996 with 3050 and she contributed a 685 scratch. In 1995 her Harford County Mixed team came in first with 2689.

Her Maryland State achievements include:

1998 The Secretary's Award for the highest scratch game of the tournament with 279

A Mixed Doubles title and a Mixed Team title  
1999 1st Place Singles Scratch in the MSWBA  
Championship Tournament with 698.

To date, her career high includes (4)700 series with 745 the highest. She has rolled (2) "300" games. Her first came at Country Club Lanes in April 1997. The second was at Harford Lanes in June 1999 in the High Rollers Tournament.

She is the first WTBC member to roll a 300 game at Harford Lanes. She also has (2) 298 games. One was in the Inaugural PWBA Aberdeen Open Regional in 1997 (she finished 8th) and the other was in the Maryland State Mixed Tournament in 1999.

In 1997 she won the Harford Invitational and went on to take that title again in 1998, 1999 and 2001. One of only two women in its history to win four times.

From 1996 to the present time shows how serious Cheryl was at improving her game:

For averaging 210 in the 1997-98 season she received the WTBC High Average award.

She is a member of the local 500 and 600 Clubs and the Maryland State 700 Club. She currently bowls in the Perry Point VAMC league at Harford Lanes and substitutes in several others.
